

2009-2010 TEACH Grant Application

The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant is awarded by Wayne State University to students who are completing, or intend to complete, coursework to begin a career in teaching and who agree to serve for a minimum of four years as a full-time, highly-qualified, high-need field teacher in a low-income school.

If students awarded the TEACH Grant do not complete the four years of qualified teaching service within eight years of completing the course of study for which the TEACH Grant was received, or otherwise fail to meet any other requirement of the TEACH Grant, the Grant will convert into a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan, with interest accrued and capitalized from the date of original disbursement.

To apply for the award as Wayne State University students must:

- Complete a 2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASFA) at <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/>
- Meet certain academic achievement requirements (generally, scoring above the 75th percentile on a college admissions test or maintaining a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25).
- Enroll in coursework necessary to complete a teacher certification in a high-need field (NOTE: You are not required to be admitted to the College of Education to qualify for the TEACH Grant).
- Complete TEACH Grant Entrance Counseling.
- Complete an Agreement to Serve and Promise to Pay from the Department of Education. ***(Students will NOT be able to sign the Agreement to Serve until the student has been awarded).***
- Serve as a full-time teacher in a low-income school, as a highly-qualified teacher, and in a high-need field as listed in the Nationwide List for the State in which you will be teaching for the majority of classes taught for at least four years within eight calendar years of leaving the program for which you received the TEACH Grant.
- Write to the Secretary of Education (within 120 days of completing or otherwise leaving the program of study for which the TEACH Grant was received) confirming that you are employed as a full-time teacher in accordance with the terms of the TEACH Grant, or you are not yet employed as a full-time teacher but intend to meet the terms of the TEACH Grant service agreement
- Respond promptly to any requests for information or documentation from the U.S. Department of Education.
- Submit upon completion of each year of teaching service, documentation of the service in the form of a certification by a chief administrative officer of the school
- Comply with all other terms, conditions, and requirements that the Secretary of Education determines to be necessary.
- **Post-bachelor students enrolled at WSU do not qualify for this program.**
- **If you have already been awarded up to your cost of attendance, receiving the TEACH grant will result in the reduction of your federal subsidized, unsubsidized, and/or PLUS loan offers.**

If you fail to meet any of these terms the teach grant funds you receive will convert into a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford loan, with interest accrued and capitalized from the date of original disbursement. Once this grant is converted to a loan, it cannot be converted back to a grant.

I understand that I will have to sign an Agreement to Serve for the TEACH grant each year that I am eligible.

I understand that if I am not able to meet the conditions outlined in the Agreement to Serve the TEACH Grant will convert to a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan, and the interest will be backdated to the time of the grant disbursement.

I understand that in order to keep the grant from becoming a loan, I must teach for four of the eight years following the completion of my program in a high-need subject area and in a low-income school regardless of the number of years I received the grant.

I understand that if I have already been awarded up to my cost of attendance, receiving the TEACH grant will result in the reduction of my federal subsidized, unsubsidized loan, and/or PLUS loan award.

Conditions of the TEACH Grant

I understand that by signing and submitting this form, I am requesting the WSU Office of Student Financial Aid determine my eligibility for the TEACH grant and, if it is determined that I am eligible, to add the grant to my award package. **IMPORTANT: If you fail to complete this service obligation, all amounts of TEACH Grants that you received will be converted to a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan. You must then repay this loan to the U.S. Department of Education. You will be charged interest from the date the grant(s) was disbursed.**
