

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER MATCH CONFIRMATION

According to information we received on your Free Application for Federal Student aid (FAFSA) there is a discrepancy regarding the social security number (SSN), name, and/or date of birth you reported on the FAFSA with the information reported in the Social Security Administration's (SSA) records. Please review the information below for instructions regarding how to resolve this matter. Please submit any required documentation to Wayne State University, Office of Student Financial Aid, Welcome Center, 42 West Warren, Detroit, MI 48201.

SSA could not confirm that the SSN the student reported on the FAFSA is correct.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If the student's SSN is correct, he/she must contact SSA at 1-800-772-1213 or by visiting www.socialsecurity.gov. After SSA corrects its records the student can reenter his/her SSN on the FAFSA at www.fafsa.ed.gov and submit a correction for resolution. • If the student's SSN is incorrect, the student should file a new FAFSA with the correct SSN. This application will be treated as an original application.
The date of birth the student reported on the FAFSA does not match the date of birth in the SSA records for the student's SSN.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The student must provide the Office of Student Financial aid date of birth documentation. Examples of documentation that can be submitted are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Copy of driver's license or State ID ○ Copy of birth certificate
The name the student reported on the FAFSA does not match the name in the SSA records for the student's SSN.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The student must provide the Office of Student Financial Aid documentation explaining the name discrepancy. Examples of documentation that can be submitted are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Copy of marriage license ○ Copy of divorce decree ○ Copy of a court order

If it is necessary for you to correct your FAFSA information please ensure that you provide a student PIN/signature and if you are a dependent student a parental PIN/signature as well when making your correction to the FAFSA.

We cannot proceed with your financial aid application until your social security number match discrepancy is resolved. Many financial aid programs have specific deadlines and delays in processing may result in a reduction or loss of potential financial aid awards. Be sure to include your name and student ID number on any documents you submit.
